

Determine Your Goal

Decide if you're decluttering, funding a project, preparing for a move, or simply letting go of extra items.

Set the Date & Time

Weekends (especially Saturday) from 8 AM – 2
PM usually attract the biggest crowds. Pick a backup date in case of



05 Plan for Post-sale Dispersal

Decide ahead of time what to do with items that don't sell. Consider donating, consigning, or responsibly disposing of them—just don't bring them back in the house!

Check Local Regulations

Look into any needed permits, sign rules, or HOA/neighborhood restrictions to avoid last-minute surprises.

04

Plan for the sale

Have tarps or pop-up tents ready just in case. Make sure there's visible parking or signage to guide visitors safely.

- Set up tents or tarps for weather
- Add clear signage and parking markers
- Organize items neatly on tables
- Keep change and bags ready
- Assign someone to handle cash
- Keep valuables near checkout

Gathering Your Resources

Recruit Help

Enlist friends, family members, or neighbors to assist with setup, sales, and cleanup

Gather Items Needed

Collect tables, clothing racks, price stickers, cash box with change, bags for customers, calculator, and extension cords

Create Timeline

Plan your timeline for sorting, cleaning, pricing, setup, and post-sale donations





• Declutter & Sort

Create four categories: "Sell," "Donate," "Keep," and "Trash"

• Clean & Test Items

Wipe down surfaces, test all electronics, and make minor repairs if needed

Price Items

Set prices with the goal of selling items, not ending up paying to donate them. When downsizing, the idea is to recoup a bit of money—enough to help cover any costs involved in donating what's left.



Advertising & Promotion

Online Classifieds

Post on Facebook Marketplace, Craigslist, NextDoor, and other online platforms with clear photos and details



Local Media

Place ads in community newspapers and post flyers on neighborhood bulletin boards with tear-off phone numbers





■ Street Signs

Create large weather-resistant signs with bold lettering, clear arrows, and your address





Early Start



Begin setup at least 1-2 hours before your advertised opening time to handle early birds

Organize By Category




Group similar items together (kitchen, books, clothes) and create clear walkways

Payment Station



The best way to handle cash is to wear a money belt, have a calculator handy, keep bags ready for purchases, and assign someone to oversee the cash area at all times for security and efficiency.





Engage & Sell!



Greet shoppers warmly, answer questions, and share interesting stories about special items

Negotiate Wisely


Be prepared to haggle, but know your bottom price for valuable items

Keep It Tidy

Regularly reset displays and consolidate as items sell to keep everything looking appealing

Last Hour Deals

Offer special incentives like "Fill a bag for \$5" or "Half price on everything" to clear inventory







Secure Money

Safely store earnings in a secure location and consider depositing cash at the bank promptly



Remove Signs

Take down all directional signs and advertisements immediately after the sale

Transport donation items within 24 hours and request a receipt for tax purposes

Risk & Safety Tips for Hosting a Yard Sale



Items on the ground, extension cords, and uneven surfaces can cause customers to trip and fall. To mitigate this, ensure pathways are clear and items are displayed on sturdy tables.



Secure Your Home

Lock interior doors not used for the sale and post "No Entry" signs at private areas. Keep valuables completely out of sight or locked away.



Extreme heat, rain, or thunderstorms can make the sale uncomfortable or dangerous. Consider having a backup plan like a tent or moving items indoors.



Never Host Alone


Always have family, friends, or neighbors present. Rotate shifts to prevent fatigue and maintain constant supervision. Use phones to stay connected. Always have your phone on you so you can always call for help



Avoid selling items that could cause injury, such as knives, firearms, or fireworks.



Designate one trusted person to handle money. Use a secure waist pouch or lockbox for cash. Consider mobile payment options like the ones below:

- Complete control over the process
- Keep 100% of profits
- Set your own schedule and pace

- Responsible for all logistics and cleanup

Hire Professional Help

- Expertise in pricing and merchandising
- · Less emotional labor for you
- Minimal time commitment
- Often includes setup and cleanup
- Service fees (typically 30-40% of sales)
- Potentially higher sale prices due to experience
